The Regional Coordination Group on SDG4-Education 2030 in West and Central Africa (RCG4-WCA)

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Introduction


Since its establishment in June 2016, the Regional Coordination Group on SDG4-Education 2030 in West and Central Africa (RCG4-WCA) has worked to harmonise partner support to member states in the West and Central Africa (WCA) region to achieve the objectives of global and continental education and training programmes: the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 4-Education 2030 and the Continental Education Strategy for Africa 2016-2025 (CESA 16-25).

Composed of 28 organisations and eight thematic task teams, the RCG4-WCA aims to position itself at the crossroads of the WCA education community and to establish links across the continent, with the African Union (AU), but also with the CESA 16-25. At the international level, the RCG4-WCA is in harmony with the global education community through its participation in the SDG4-Education 2030 Steering Committee. The Group also supports national adaptation, implementation and monitoring of SDG4-Education 2030 and of CESA 16-25. Through capacity building, advocacy, information sharing and dissemination of analysis and tools, the RCG4-WCA has continued to build and strengthen relationships in the region towards a common goal of quality and inclusive education for all by 2020.

The year 2020 was marked by the health crisis caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. In the face of this new reality, the Regional Coordination Group has increased initiatives to link the continental and regional levels with the national level to disseminate new ideas on how to address the crisis affecting education in all African countries. This knowledge platform (<http://www.education2030-africa.org/index.php/en/>) promotes capacity development and enhances knowledge sharing and collaboration across the continent against the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on education and its monitoring tool, SDG 4.

Overview of the structure of the RCG4-WCA

Members of the RCG4-WCA Plenary Group are regional or international actors in education development and humanitarian assistance, including UN agencies, civil society and multilateral organisations, higher education networks, the research community, representatives of teachers and regional economic communities. The RCG4-WCA brings together its members to define and coordinate collective strategies and actions for technical assistance, advocacy, capacity development, and for an exchange of good practices, tools and information.



The eight task teams of the RCG4-WCA focus on specific education themes:

1. Strengthening education systems (SYSTeam)
2. Teaching and learning (TALENT)
3. Early Childhood
4. Higher education
5. Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET)
6. Gender & Inclusion in Education (GENIE)
7. Learning to live together (LTLT)
8. Education in emergencies

Achievements of the Secretariat and task teams in 2020

The Secretariat

During the year 2021, the Secretariat of the RCG4-WCA carried out the following activities:

- Online launch of UNESCO's 2020 Global Monitoring Report on Education in West and Central Africa ;
- Organisation and coordination of the continental contribution (beyond West and Central Africa) to the extraordinary session of the 2020 Global Education Meeting (GEM 2020);
- Informing the group on the meetings of the Global Steering Committee (SDG4 - Education 2030), regular sharing of relevant information on the COVID-19 crisis and adequate responses by development partners and on the activities of the Global Coalition, multi-sectoral partnerships to support countries;
- Consultation with the African Union Commission to launch in 2021, the elaboration of the continental report SDG4 - CESA: terms of reference elaborated and shared.

TALENT

Despite the constraints of the pandemic, the *TALENT* team whose activities support teaching and learning in sub-Saharan Africa, with a particular focus on the alignment of curriculum, pedagogy and assessment, has been able to carry out the following activities:

- The finalisation and launch of a mapping study on learning assessment systems in Sub-Saharan Africa (SSA);
- The organisation of learning series on the integration of 21st century skills in a perspective of aligning education systems in SSA (session 1: An introduction to 21st century skills; session 2: Pedagogical practices, assessment and curricula; session 3: Policies and planning for 21st century skills);
- The production of a policy brief on the effective use of large-scale learning assessments data;
- The analysis of distance formative and summative assessments in the face of COVID-19 and the formulation of guidelines for formative assessment in distance education in SSA;
- The publication of the biannual *TALENT* newsletter;
- The production of resource mobilisation materials for teaching and learning activities.

Early Childhood

The *Early Childhood* Task Team supports early childhood development and early childhood education. Despite the difficulties in bringing the group together due to the response to COVID-19, the team carried out the following activities:

- Five webinars organised with Imagination AFRIKA, TOSTAN, AFCEN & IICBA, SAVE THE CHILDREN on the use of social media for parent support, evidence-based parenting education programme, distance education for pre-primary children, early childhood development in education in emergency situations;
- A regional survey on the effects of COVID-19 on teachers: draft report available (joint activity with cluster AU/ECD and *TALENT*);
- A regional advocacy document on pre-primary education: terms of reference developed with *TALENT* and CONFEMEN, MOU with UNESCO *TALENT* planned for January 2021.

Learning to live together

The *Learning to Live Together* team aims to increase collaboration and dialogue as well as information sharing among members of the RCG4-WCA who support areas related to education for sustainable development and global citizenship education. In 2020, the task team proceeded to:

- The expansion of the team with the entry of the Portuguese Embassy in Senegal and Manos Unidos;

- Exchanges of knowledge with the TALENT team on 21st century skills in relation to 4.7 target of SDG 4;
- The redesign of the platform (<https://vivons-ensemble.net/>) with an ergonomic interface and a better structuring of the content (educational resources, articles, etc.);
- The implementation of the CoLAB workspace (<https://colab.vivons-ensemble.net/>) for sharing resources between countries.

GENIE

The *GENIE* task team contributes to improving equity in education in West and Central Africa, using the extensive knowledge and expertise of member organisations in gender equality and inclusive education in the region. The group has carried out the following activities:

- Development of a policy brief on inclusive education, with a special focus on disability: translation into English, printing and dissemination ;
- Improvement of knowledge on children with disabilities and strengthening of education management information systems for the production of data on schooling of children with disabilities in WCA countries. (activity started with a concept note and an indicative plan for a regional report on the education of children living with disabilities using MICS6 data);
- Contribution to the development of the AU Continental Strategy on Education for the Health and Well-being of Adolescents and Youth in Africa (in progress) ;
- Presentation and dissemination of the results of the study on Economic Barriers to Education. Study on the mapping of 24 WCA countries on the abolition of school fees (ongoing activity) ;
- WCA commitment to educated, healthy and fulfilled adolescents and youth (CSE and SSR services): regional report being finalised, country fact sheets available, nine national consultations conducted ;
- 2020 University on Gender Responsive Education Planning: 3-week online training (finalised 29/01/ 2021).

SYSteam

The *SYSteam* focuses on developing tools and frameworks, sharing good practices and supporting national capacity building in sector planning and data systems in the context of SDG4-Education 2030. It has made the following achievements in 2020:

- Development of a concept note on improving data quality with UNICEF and UIS for the development of a continental strategy on Education Management Information Systems;
- Capacity building workshop on SDG4 and CESA data reporting;
- Support for the development of country reports for monitoring the SDG4 and CESA indicators;
- Development of a concept note on the production of the SDG4 and CESA continental monitoring report.

Higher education

The task team on *higher education* carries out sub-thematic monitoring actions on governance, the Bachelor-Master-Doctorate reform, quality assurance, professionalisation and management of higher education information systems. In 2020, the team carried out:

- a mapping of national initiatives or development actions in CAMES member countries in the framework of a project to strengthen and update the CAMES regional certification and qualification framework;
- a contribution to the African Continental Qualifications Framework (ACQF) peer learning webinars

Education in emergencies

The group on *education in emergencies* was formed in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic in response to the impact of the health crisis on education. This group formally integrated RCG4-WCA as a task team and organised the following activities:

- Presentation of the 2020 EUA report ;
- Presentation of a digital learning platform project ;
- Presentation of good practices on reopening schools, based on the inter-agency guide "Safe return to school";
- Drafting of an advocacy note for the post-COVID-19 reopening of schools;
- Social media campaign for the International Day of Education;
- Presentation of the PASS project in Burkina Faso, Mali, Niger;
- Presentation of the Pilot Programmatic Partnership;
- Presentation of the MYRPs (Sahel) by the national Clusters.

Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET)

The *TVET* team is being launched. Its terms of reference were developed in 2020. It will contribute to improving the efficiency and quality of TVET systems in Africa in order to develop relevant skills that meet labour market demand and socio-economic development needs.

Knowledge sharing activities related to COVID-19

In the face of the COVID19 pandemic, governments around the world have taken drastic measures to safeguard the health of populations. The world was faced with a series of school closures that threatened

the continuity of learning. This situation prompted members of the RCG4-WCA to reflect on emergency solutions to mitigate the loss of learning while ensuring the continuity of quality and inclusive learning. Webinars were therefore organised to share information, experiences and good practices with countries in the region so that they can continue to ensure quality learning continuity.

Constraints and challenges in the context of COVID-19

La pandémie de la COVID-19 a affecté le fonctionnement des équipes de travail du GRC4-AOC. Les groupes ont rencontré des difficultés dans l'exécution de leurs activités ainsi que des challenges dans le contexte de la COVID-19, notamment :

The COVID-19 pandemic affected the functioning of the RCG4-WCA task teams. The groups encountered difficulties in carrying out their activities and challenges in the context of COVID-19, including :

- Delays in the implementation of the activities initially planned in the work plans;
- Insufficient monitoring and evaluation of SDG4 and the CESA in the countries after five years of implementation of the two agendas;
- Difficulty in mobilising team members within the framework of the activities;
- The lack of financial resources mobilised by the partners to support the countries;
- The modification, postponement or cancellation of certain activities because of COVID-19;
- The negative impact of the proliferation of activities on the group's quarterly meetings;
- Limited human resources.

Suggestions for improving team functionality in 2021

The members of the RCG4-WCA made a few suggestions to improve the way task teams work: These are:

- Strengthen the synergy and exchanges between the different working groups while stimulating members for more dynamism and active participation in the activities;
- Explore opportunities to work with LEGs to take into account their needs and to mobilise resources to support countries;
- Involve the SYSteam working group in the monitoring and evaluation of SDG4 and the CESA in collaboration with the LEGs of the countries;
- Renew the composition of the groups by consulting the different members and see to what extent new members should be included;
- Strengthen the knowledge management component of the group using the SDG 4 platform (document collection, database of member profiles, events);
- Collaborate with other thematic groups of SDG 4 as well as with the AU/ECD group;
- Define cross-cutting issues to carry out more joint activities within and between groups.

Prospects for 2021

In 2021, the teams will develop their work plans in the light of the five thematic priorities identified in the 2020 GEM declaration, which are (i) Education finance, (ii) safe school reopening, (iii) teachers, (iv) skills development for employment, (v) digital educational resources and connectivity, while taking into account



equity, inclusion and gender equality as cross-cutting themes. They will also ensure that they take into account the 2020 achievements, the Global Cooperation Mechanism in Education, collaboration within the framework of the CESA 16-25 and the UN and African Union reforms.
